

2021-2022 Years in Review

The year 2021 would be best described as the year of change at Mt. Spokane, in many respects. For the Friends group, 2021 brought a new board and slate of officers as the founder of the original Friends group, Cris Currie, retired after almost 26 years of faithful service. At the same time new park rangers were hired and the new General Manager at Mt. Spokane Ski concession was kicking off many new initiatives for uphill skiing, Vista House hospitality services, etc. So it was an interesting new set of faces around the mountain in general.

Most of our activities in 2021 consisted of monthly board meetings via Zoom in addition to the following activities:

January 2022- First Day snowshoe treks in partnership with State Parks.

Trail 130 cleanup and blue diamond replacement work party.

Board votes to underwrite a State Parks trail map project. (Pictured to the left) **February 2022-** Board votes to redesign the current Friends website.

Spokane Parks guided moonlight hike and Mt Kit Carson hikes.

July 2022- Map committee meets with State Parks to review progress on the map design and offer inputs on various trails and overall layout.

August 2022- Four Summits hike another big success! New website project launched in earnest. (*Pictured to the right*)

September 2022- Wood-splitting and restocking of the Snowshoe Hut firewood. Spokane Mountaineers graciously donated a few felled trees and Friends volunteers split the wood, transported it to the Hairpin Turn parking lot and after much wrangling, got the gate open to drive it to Smith Gap and refill the firewood shed.
